The Palestinian village of Suba was destroyed in July 1948 by the Palmach (the Jewish paramilitary force during the British Mandate of Palestine, later assimilated into the Israel Defense Forces) and established soon after as what is now known as Tzova, a kibbutz on the outskirts of Jerusalem. The undeveloped areas, including parts of the old village, are filled with many kinds of edible

plants and fruit trees, making Suba a regular foraging spot for my parents.
